URBAN STYLE





OUTDOOR ELEMENTS



MULTIPURPOSE ARCHITECTURE

For multipurpose structures, we chose to put cabinets underneath the stairs, pull out storage underneath the kitchen benches, and a hanging picture that pulls down in the shape of a table. Underneath the stairs would be used as closet space, giving the owner a place to hang clothes or keep them folded. Pull out drawers are an added space for either a pantry or a place to hold pots and pans. The picture can work as either a decorative piece or something to use as a table if guests have been invited over.



NON-ARCHITECTURE MULTIPURPOSE



We chose a fold out desk with printer storage, stackable stools, and a convertible, portable, TV tray as our non-architectural multipurpose objects. The fold out desk was chosen because it can be used as a desk or an end table as well as having secret printer storage which is essential for any college student. Stackable stools can be stacked in a random corner when not in use and then pulled out individually when needed. TV tray can become something to do work on while in bed, extra cutting space in the kitchen, and a mini table when watching TV with guests.




TINY HOUSE STUDY
